
Help with Transparent Language Online



How to use Transparent Language Online


Go to <u>eInformation: Online Reference Library</u> and click **A-Z of electronic resources**.



Then scroll down to **Transparent Language Online**.




To start learning you will need to set up an account. When you have filled in your details and agreed to the terms and conditions, you'll be able to log in anywhere with your email address and password.




Choose the language you want to learn from the list available.


You can set your own daily learning goal.
